- WHEREAS, the designation of the Grand Canyon Heritage National Monument will ban new uranium mining claims within the Monument.
- **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, the member Tribes of the Inter Tribal Association of Arizona support the passage of HR 3882 to create the Grand Canyon Heritage National Monument.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, if the Congressional effort to pass HR 3882 does not proceed the member Tribes of the Inter Tribal Association of Arizona support a Presidential Proclamation establishing the Grand Canyon Heritage National Monument under the authority of the Antiquities Act.
