



## AMENDMENTS TO NATURAL RESOURCES TITLE OF H. CON. RES. 14

<b>Amendment #20 by Huffman</b>	Strikes Arctic Refuge leasing provisions and replaces with the Arctic Refuge Protection Act
<b>Amendment #21 by Huffman</b>	Requires that only oil and gas companies with experience with successful development can bid on leases on the Coastal Plain of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge
<b>Amendment #22 by Huffman</b>	Requires that coal provisions can only take effect if the Secretary and GAO certify that coal is cost competitive with renewable energy sources
<b>Amendment #34 by Huffman</b>	Strikes section that rescinds the Boundary Waters mining withdrawal and that reinstates the Twin Metals leases
<b>Amendment #35 by Huffman</b>	Prohibits mining in the Boundary Waters watershed unless GAO and other entities including Minnesota certify that it will not impair water quality
<b>Amendment #36 by Huffman</b>	Strikes sections that are straight out of Project 2025
<b>Amendment #39 by Huffman</b>	Prevents offshore oil and gas leasing in the Gulf of Mexico until cancer rates in Cancer Alley, Louisiana, match the national average
<b>Amendment #102 by Huffman</b>	Prohibits funds from being used to procure seafood originating or processed in countries identified for failure to address illegal, unreported, or unregulated fishing, bycatch of marine wildlife, or shark management
<b>Amendment #105 by Huffman</b>	Redirects funds to support international conservation
<b>Amendment #106 by Huffman</b>	Title shall not take effect until the Office of Inspector General submits a report on Elon Musk's conflicts of interest
<b>Amendment #162 by Huffman</b>	Requires foreign adversaries (including state-owned companies and subsidiaries) to shall pay a royalty for hardrock mining on U.S. public lands
<b>Amendment #197 by Huffman</b>	Requires tribal consultation on the decision to approve Ambler Road
<b>Amendment #220 by Huffman</b>	Section shall not take effect until the Comptroller General certifies that the Bureau of Reclamation has hired all staff pushed out by DOGE
<b>Amendment #221 by Huffman</b>	Title shall not be construed to authorize the Bureau of Reclamation to violate or preempt state laws, including laws related to protection of fish species
<b>Amendment #247 by Huffman</b>	Strikes section on NEPA pay to play
<b>Amendment #248 by Huffman</b>	Title shall not take effect until GAO certifies that no IRA permitting funds are rescinded by this Act
<b>Amendment #11 by Neguse</b>	Prevents funds for eliminating NOAA programs that provide data and services to protect life and property from extreme weather and natural disasters
<b>Amendment #68 by Neguse</b>	Prevents funding to be used to cancel leases or otherwise close DOI, USFS, and NOAA offices
<b>Amendment #87 by Neguse</b>	Redirects funds to Colorado River drought resiliency
<b>Amendment #138 by Neguse</b>	Prohibits funds from being used to reduce or eliminate national monuments

<b>Amendment #139 by Neguse</b>	Strikes recission of National Park Service funds
<b>Amendment #185 by Neguse</b>	Title shall not take effect until the Comptroller General certifies that the administration has reinstated all terminated employees who are qualified to assist with firefighting efforts
<b>Amendment #225 by Neguse</b>	Strikes Colorado Resource Management Plans
<b>Amendment #253 by Neguse</b>	No funds or revenues in the Title can be used to transfer or sell off public lands
<b>Amendment #2 by Leger Fernandez</b>	Prevents onshore oil and gas royalty reductions from taking effect if they negatively impact state budgets, including for education and law enforcement
<b>Amendment #17 by Leger Fernandez</b>	Redirects funds to the Bureau of Indian Affairs Office of Justice Services
<b>Amendment #38 by Leger Fernandez</b>	Redirects funds to the Indian Health Service
<b>Amendment #59 by Leger Fernandez</b>	Title shall not take effect until GAO and the Secretary of the Interior certify that the Department will not authorize any mining project within a <u>National Forest</u> if the Secretary finds that the project applicant is a foreign entity of concern or subsidiary of a foreign entity of concern
<b>Amendment #60 by Leger Fernandez</b>	Title shall not take effect until GAO and the Secretary of the Interior certify that the Department will not authorize any mining project within a <u>National Park</u> if the Secretary finds that the project applicant is a foreign entity of concern or subsidiary of a foreign entity of concern
<b>Amendment #69 by Leger Fernandez</b>	Title shall not take effect until the Comptroller of the United States certifies that wildfire mitigation is fully funded in accordance with law
<b>Amendment #84 by Leger Fernandez</b>	Title shall not take effect until the Secretary of the Interior and Comptroller General certify that the President's trade war will not increase the cost of energy
<b>Amendment #88 by Leger Fernandez</b>	Redirects coal funds to support Drought and Water Programs
<b>Amendment #230 by Leger Fernandez</b>	Exempts tribal claims from restrictions on judicial review
<b>Amendment #231 by Leger Fernandez</b>	Exempts Tribes from having to pay protest fees
<b>Amendment #232 by Leger Fernandez</b>	Requires that oil and gas companies reclaim any wells that have been idled for over 7 years before they can participate in noncompetitive leasing
<b>Amendment #9 by Stansbury</b>	Prevents funds from being used to permit foreign adversaries and known bad actors to mine on federal lands
<b>Amendment #109 by Stansbury</b>	Strikes Arctic Refuge provision and inserts protections for subsistence resources of Alaska Native tribes
<b>Amendment #150 by Stansbury</b>	Directs funds to Inspectors General at applicable agencies to investigate and report to Congress on DOGE impacts to staffing, program services, funding, and data
<b>Amendment #163 by Stansbury</b>	Prohibits oil and gas activities within one mile of polar bear maternal den habitat
<b>Amendment #176 by Stansbury</b>	Strikes IRA recissions for Bureau of Land Management and National Park Service
<b>Amendment #238 by Stansbury</b>	Prohibits the Act from impinging on tribal trust and treaty rights, including religious and subsistence rights

<b>Amendment #70 by Hoyle</b>	Redirects funds to improve wildfire resilience and forest management
<b>Amendment #186 by Hoyle</b>	Title shall not take effect until the Secretary of Energy and the Comptroller General certify that firings at the Power Marketing Administrations will not result in a loss of power for ratepayers
<b>Amendment #57 by Magaziner</b>	Title cannot take effect until the restoration of NOAA funding, staff, and offices that support military readiness
<b>Amendment #213 by Magaziner</b>	Strikes recission of funds for NOAA facilities and investments in coastal communities and climate resilience
<b>Amendment #44 by Min</b>	Require DOI to increase financial assurances from oil and gas companies before reduced royalties can take effect
<b>Amendment #45 by Min</b>	No lease sales until the Administration's national energy policy includes wind and solar energy
<b>Amendment #48 by Min</b>	No leases under this title awarded to any entity with overdue decommissioning on existing facilities or who do not meet a fitness to operate standard
<b>Amendment #182 by Min</b>	Prohibits funds for existing federal contracts with Elon Musk's companies until the Office of Inspector General determines he has not violated the conflicts of interest criminal law
<b>Amendment #15 by Dexter</b>	Requires 0.5% of new funds and revenues to go to oversight and accountability of the expenditure of the funds and proceeds
<b>Amendment #51 by Dexter</b>	Prohibits oil and gas leases under this title within 3,200 feet of a school or hospital
<b>Amendment #229 by Dexter</b>	Strikes protest fees
<b>Amendment #122 by Hernández</b>	Redirects revenues to coral reef conservation in the Insular Areas
<b>Amendment #201 by Hernández</b>	Title shall not take effect until the Secretary of Energy certifies that financing for utility-scale solar and storage projects for Puerto Rico will be implemented on time
<b>Amendment #18 by Randall</b>	Redirects funds to Bureau of Indian Education Post Secondary Programs
<b>Amendment #143 by Randall</b>	Title shall not take effect until NOAA programs that process permits are fully staffed and operational
<b>Amendment #144 by Randall</b>	Title shall not take effect until IJA funding for fish passage programs is released
<b>Amendment #244 by Randall</b>	Redirects funds to Bureau of Indian Affairs realty programs that support land into trust
<b>Amendment #19 by Ansari</b>	Denies access to the new leases for oil and gas companies if they have been found liable for collusion
<b>Amendment #54 by Ansari</b>	Prevents the bill's increases of royalties on renewable energy unless the Secretary of the Interior and the Comptroller General certify that it will not increase energy prices
<b>Amendment #124 by Ansari</b>	Redirects funds to support efforts to forecast, mitigate, and respond to extreme heat

<b>Amendment #191 by Ansari</b>	Prohibits funds for transferring management of public lands on the border
<b>Amendment #129 by Elfreth</b>	Ensures any offshore oil and gas leasing is in compliance with the most recent Department of Defense Mission Compatibility Planning Assessment for BOEM offshore leasing plans
<b>Amendment #209 by Elfreth</b>	Title shall not take effect until the Comptroller General certifies that funding and staffing for AmeriCorps and Conservation Corps have been restored
<b>Amendment #300 by Gray</b>	Strikes entire title except for surface water storage and water conveyance sections and increases funding for those sections to \$40 billion (for context, the entire Western water piece of the IIJA was \$8.7 billion)
<b>Amendment #43 by Rivas</b>	Uses revenues from new oil and gas development to mitigate and remediate pollution in environmental justice communities
<b>Amendment #183 by Rivas</b>	Prohibits funds for new contracts with Elon Musk's companies until the Offices of Inspectors General determines he has not violated the conflicts of interest criminal law
<b>Amendment #210 by Rivas</b>	Strikes rescission of environmental and climate data collection and EJ Screen
<b>Amendment #82 by Dingell</b>	Prohibits rescission of funds for Great Lakes fisheries, harmful algal blooms, and resilience
<b>Amendment #239 by Dingell</b>	Strikes royalty decrease and redirects funds to support sea lamprey control program in the Great Lakes
<b>Amendment #13 by Soto</b>	Redirects funds to coral reef conservation
<b>Amendment #148 by Soto</b>	Title shall not take effect until GAO certifies that the President has permanent banned on offshore drilling in the Eastern Gulf
<b>Amendment #61 by Brownley</b>	Requires the Bureau of Safety and Environmental Enforcement to issue regulations to assess an annual fee on owners of offshore oil and gas pipelines
<b>Amendment #65 by Brownley</b>	Redirects funds to NOAA climate monitoring, weather forecasts, and disaster preparedness
<b>Amendment #301 by Ansari</b>	Strikes text and inserts the Stock Act 2.0 to close existing loopholes and impose stricter regulations on financial activities of government officials
